File <u>21-0318</u> proposes an increase in reporting capability for fireworks surrounding the Fourth of July and New Year's Day holidays as well as programs to buy back illegal fireworks and offering rewards for reporting fireworks sellers. Fireworks pose numerous issues for residents and animals and produce plumes of smoke laden with particles that are harmful to the respiratory systems of humans and other animals. Birds caught in or near fireworks displays easily choke on the toxic residue.
