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

The Palms Neighborhood Council supports Option 6 with modifications for the current Sepulveda Corridor options Metro is considering. Our priorities are:

- Rail cars that are interchangeable with the other Metro Rail lines
- A stop at UCLA
- A stop at the Expo Line Sepulveda Station (not currently part of Option 6)

We support a heavy rail approach to the Sepulveda Corridor project for a couple of reasons

Heavy rail will be more expensive in the short run. In the long run it will be better for the Metro rail system as a whole assuming the heavy rail tracks and cars used for the project are compatible with existing lines. Using cars that are interchangeable between the various lines improves the ability to provide maintenance and add more cars to one line over another when traffic patterns change. This project should not be built without rail car compatibility.

Underground heavy rail allows us to have a station on the UCLA campus without introducing a second or third mode of transportation between the line and the campus. If we don't have a stop at UCLA, in 20 years our children will look at us and ask us what we were thinking.

The Palms Neighborhood Council also supports a terminus at Sepulveda Station instead of Bundy. A stop at Sepulveda allows for transfer to the Culver City number 6 bus line and continuing travel to LAX until a rail option is constructed. The Palms Neighborhood Council would support option 5 if the train cars and rails are compatible with the existing lines.
