 - i. We are getting low on the ones we have and they need to be replenished.
 - ii. We can purchase the design we have now (a big Palms NC logo on one side of the bag from a local Palms company) for \$1059.96 for 100 bags or \$1546.67 for 150 bags. These bags are a heavier canvas fabric than the ones we have.
 - iii. We can purchase a design that covers the full bag on both sides from an Orange County company for \$701.44 for 100 bags, \$1052.16 for 150 bags, or \$1402.88 for 200 bags. The "all over print" is a new service from this company and they're introducing it at 50% off what will be its normal price. See this link for what Mid
